GAS, ELECTRIC AND WATER SAFETY

Gas safety

Just as you would at home, it's a good idea to double-check that you've turned the gas cooker off properly before going to bed. Please do not attempt to make any changes to the gas boiler. The only heating adjustments needed can be made by adjusting the thermostatic valves in each room. If you are not sure how to use the gas cooker or if you have any doubts about cooker or boiler, please get in touch with us. In extremis, the gas cut-off valve is outside the cottage, in the meter cupboard. The key for this is in the drawer of the console table in the hall.

Electrical safety


The supply board (circuit breakers and supply main switch) if needed in Emergency, are located in the cupboard between the entrance door and downstairs bedroom. This is opened by releasing the push-push catch by pressing on the door at top left.

Water Safety

Before you wash or enjoy a bath, take a second to carefully check the temperature of hot water from the taps - it might be hotter than the water you're used to at home. Take extra care that children are supervised in the bathroom.

In event of a leak or other uncontrolled escape of water, please turn off the supply before trying to contact us, so as to limit damage and the safety risk to yourselves. Water and electricity don't mix well and we have, sadly, recent experience of what happens when water gets where it is not supposed to be. The water shut-off valve is beneath a hatch in the under-stairs cupboard. The hatch is immediately in front of the washing machine.

If the washing machine has rocked forward in use, it may be necessary to push it back before opening the hatch. Please do not try to pull it forward into the hallway. Lift the ring pull and pull the hatch cover out. The cottage shut-off valve is the one with the blue handle as shown below.
